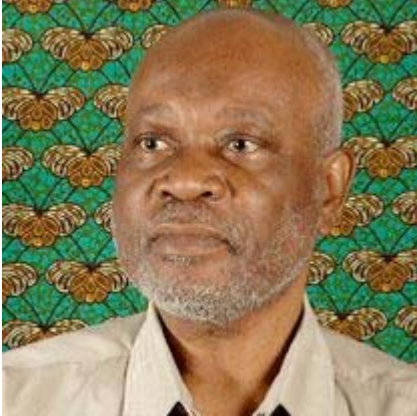

securing sensitive information

- 00:00 But see here in OTP, Office of the Prosecutor, we still have some documents and these documents are on missions, so when people come for missions, they bring very sensitive information. That's . . .
- 00:16 **Lisa Nathan: Could you give an example of what that would be?**
- 00:18 Example, the reports, mission reports. Mission reports are document-, doc-, documentation that have to be kept in a way that's only people from the unit or from OTP (\_\_\_). Even sometimes, some investigators do not have the right to know, for example, information that is coming from the tracking team.
- 00:45 Tracking team which is – I think you met them this morning – tracking team that operates mainly outside the country. They go to Europe. They go to Africa, outside Rwanda. They go to North America. They go all over the world, tracking people that the OTP is looking for.
- 01:06 So this is very sensitive information. If it falls on the hand that are not supposed to fall, it might jeopa-, jeopardize the work of the Prosecutor.
